MANCHESTER MUSEUM



ANCIENT WORLDS GALLERY

Refurbishment of the existing three gallery spaces to create the Ancient Worlds Gallery, situated on the first and second floors of the Manchester Museum - Discovering Archaeology Gallery; Egyptian Worlds Gallery; Exploring Objects Gallery.

The construction work comprised demolition and alteration works, new partitions, protective film to existing windows, perimeter walkway for services, replacement glass to balustrades, redecoration and repair/re-varnish of existing floor and mechanical and electrical installations

The exhibition fit out was procured separately by the design team and managed by the principal Contractor. These works involved the removal of some of the existing exhibition cases and protection of the remaining cases and the installation of new exhibition cases by a specialist case manufacturer.

All other gallery/exhibition areas of the museum remained open to the public during the refurbishment works.
